

Stage 1 Excursion to Sydney Sealife Aquarium



Tips from the counsellor: Supporting our STARS

Below is some information to assist children to feel supported during challenging times.

Part 1 - Helping children adjust after separation or divorce

Separation or divorce can be an unsettling time for both the family and children. It usually signals a time of big change for family life. It is normal for a child to feel upset, and that is okay. Research supports letting your child know that this is a tough time for everyone can help him/her to realise they are not the only one feeling upset.

Tips for talking with your child about separation and divorce

1. Keep it simple

Children do not need to know all the details. They do need to know what is happening and that things will be okay again.

Explain in simple language that your child will understand.

Reassure your child that both parents love him/her and will take care of them. That you have decided it works best for the family if you and your partner live apart.

Ensure your child understands; it is not their fault you have separated or divorced.

2. Take time with hard questions

Sometimes it will be difficult to answer hard questions that you and your husband may have not worked out yet. It is okay to let your child know you do not have all the answers yet, and there are still things to work out.

Encourage your children to talk to each parent directly when asking questions. Sometimes this can be hard for young children.

3. Keep up conversations

Children can often think about things long after you have talked about it. Be prepared to answer the same question more than once.

Organising a regular time to talk can give your child an opportunity to discuss any concerns they have.

4. Making time for your child to stay connected to each parent

Organise time for your child to Skype, Face Time, Voice Call, Text Message or Email each parent when they are staying/living with the other.

5. Talk about feelings

Your child will probably see either parent feeling sad, angry or upset. This is normal. Ensure your child know that your feelings are not his/her fault and that your feelings will get better in time.

When your child sees you express feelings in a calm way they learn it is okay to express their feelings too.

It might be difficult to hear about your child is hurt and/or angry but it is important they get to talk too.

6. Keep familiar routines

Routines help children feel safe and secure. Keeping up routines, such as having meals together and bedtime, help your child cope with changes.

It is important that your child knows who is picking him/her up each day, and whose place they are staying at each week, or weekend.

You can create some new routines too. This might happen if there are changes to who picks up your child or childcare arrangements.

7. Let children make some decisions

Involve your child in small day-to-day decisions such as, how they like their room, what you might do together on the weekend, or what to eat at dinner. This provides your child with a feeling of some control.

8. Make time to do things with your child

Taking the time to play board games, card games, play at the park, going for a bike, scooter ride or on a picnic helps build you to have fun with them and maintain positive connections.

9. Let childcare or school know.

Letting your child's teacher know when you are separated or divorced allows them to support and understand your child if there are any changes in their behaviour.

Child Consultation so that their experiences are understood and their needs are considered when their parents are in Family Dispute Resolution (Mediation), counselling or in a Parenting Orders Program.



帮助孩子面对家长的离异

通常这个时候家庭都会发生重大变化,孩子会难过。要是家长和他们沟通,让他们知道他们的感觉是很正常的,会有助于他们过渡。

Tips for talking with your child about separation and divorce

如何和孩子讨论离婚的事

1. Keep it simple

- ❖ 简单一点,孩子不需要知道详情。他们需要知道他们会安全就行了。
- ❖ 用简单的话解释
- ❖ 向他们保证父母都爱他们,让他们知道父母离婚对家庭是最好的
- ❖ 让孩子明白,父母离异不是他们的错

2. Take time with hard questions

- ❖ 比较复杂的问题,慢慢回答,还没有答案的就等有答案时再说。
- ❖ 鼓励你的孩子有问题直接单独问双方的家长

3. Keep up conversations

❖ 给孩子安排时间让他们问他们关心的问题。他们可能重重复复问你同一个问题,

4. Making time for your child to stay connected to each parent

❖ 让孩子能够保持和双方父母的联系。

5. Talk about feelings

- ❖ 孩子通常看到父母伤心,生气等等,要让他们知道那不是他们的错,而且父母 会慢慢好起来的。
- ❖ 当你们心平气和的和他们沟通,那么他们也学会了表达他们的感受。
- ◆ 可能当你听到孩子说他们受到伤害,生气,你会难过。但是让他们有机会表达 是很重要的。

6. Keep familiar routines

- ❖ 保持正常的家庭生活会让孩子有安全感。比如一起吃饭或睡觉,这样有利于他们应付家里的变迁。
- ❖ 孩子要提早知道每天是谁接他们放学,他们会在那里过夜或过周末等等。
- ❖ 你也可以做一些新的安排,特别是托儿服务的改变。

7. Let children make some decisions

❖ 让孩子有机会做一些小决定,这样他们会感到生活中他们还是有些可以掌控的事。

8. Make time to do things with your child

◆ 安排时间和孩子一起玩棋子,扑克游戏,去公园玩,骑车,野餐等等,让他们 在玩乐中获取正能量。

9. Let childcare or school know.

❖ 让孩子的班主任或托儿服务的老师知道你们家庭的变化,这会有利于他们了解孩子行为的变化以及积极帮助他们。
