Continuing Covid Context

Since returning from the holiday break, our staff, students and families are continuing to support us with **safe arrival and departure practices** each day. School restrictions continue to be enacted due to ongoing COVID-19 health risks in NSW and across Australia.

Despite the ongoing pandemic challenges we are in a position to recommence many extra circular activities in the coming weeks *including; Music Tuition, Chess, Coding and Language classes.* We envisage our community users will resume their weekend lessons and programs shortly. Be assured that we are **constantly reviewing** the suitability of each of all our programs against the latest COVID-19 health and safety guidelines.

We're pleased to see our whole school community adhere to effective hygiene practices with flexibility and commitment. COVID Information and Current Updates

Too Sick for School

Please find below the procedure for students who **present sick at school and are sent home**, and the procedure for parents when **students are too sick to come to school**. These procedures are in line with the NSW Departments of Health & Education, Covid guidelines.

HWPS Procedure Students Sick/Absent

Student with flu like symptoms (including minor symptoms) is sent home;

- 1. Student experiences flu like symptoms.
- 2. Student is sent to the school office and is assessed by admin team.
- 3. A) At the office, student is not observed to have ongoing symptoms and is returned to class.
 - Teacher monitors and seeks supervisor support if concerns persist.
 - Principal is contacted and makes a final decision regarding student status.

B) Office advises parents/carer and arranges for leave for student to be picked up/removed from school.

- 4. Student takes leave and seeks medical advice.
- 5. Student must have a Covid test.
- 6. Student must report the test and result to the principal, office will update the HWPS google form to record testing details.
- 7. Student cannot return to work until they have;

⇒Returned a negative Covid test ... **And** they are also symptom free... **And** they have logged their Covid testing details into the google link. **Principal authorises their return to school.**

HWPS Procedure Students Sick/Absent

Student is absent from school.

- 1. Families will be advised of the requirement to provide absence information daily to the school.
- 2. Each day the admin team will contact students absent from school who have not made contact with the school and provided reason/medical certificate and update records.
- 3. Any student who returns to school after an unexplained absence is immediately referred to the office each morning to ensure that their absence is reviewed.
- 4. If a student has been absent due to flu like symptoms, or due to concerns for someone with whom they are in close contact, they are to leave the school until they provide Covid test results, refer to the procedure above.

** All parents and carers will be required to wait outside the school gates along the footpath, physically distanced

Healthy Choices at Homebush West Public School


