We look forward to our Lunar New Year celebration at Homebush West on Friday 19th February when we host *Jin Wu Koon's Lion Dancers* for our students only, Covid restrictions remain in place for adults and community members.

Before School Supervision - Child Safety

Parents and carers are to be reminded about issues of safety and supervision at our school. Please be aware that students on school grounds prior to 8.30am are unsupervised, and therefore, at risk of harm. Homebush West PS staff are not on duty until that time. We are very concerned for any student at school before 8.30am, without teacher/principal permission. Students are not permitted to be within the school grounds or site outside of school hours.

- School hours for students are from 8.30am to 3.00pm.
- Ideally students arrive at school by 8.45am.
- Parents with care/supervision needs prior to this time must make appropriate arrangements.
- The school is responsible to report concerns for students who are regularly on site outside of school hours.
- Parents and carers are required to ensure together we meet our duty of care, for the safety
 of our students.

Allergies and Anaphylaxis - Student Allergies

This is an important reminder that there are **children** in our school who have severe allergic reactions to a variety of allergens, the most common being peanuts. We ask that parents and carers are very mindful of what is included in children's lunch boxes.

Please avoid using nut-based spreads such as Nutella and peanut butter in student lunchboxes.

Nonetheless, any food can trigger anaphylaxis. It is critical to understand that in some people, even touching a particular food can cause a life-threatening reaction. For more information, including fact sheets and procedures in schools, see here https://allergyfacts.org.au/

Crunch & Sip, Recess and Lunch

Too Sick for School

Students who **present with any symptoms of illness at school are sent home** to seek medical advice and certification prior to returning to school. These procedures are in line with the NSW Departments of Health & Education, Covid guidelines.

Students returning to school after an illness

Parents are reminded to keep children at home if they are unwell. Once fit to return to school, parents are advised to seek **medical clearance from their GP**. Please also provide a medical certificate for the sick leave taken. Where a Covid test is required, the negative test result must be returned to the office via email prior to the child returning to school.

As always, we encourage our parents and carers to stay connected to the school community via the **SkoolBag app** and or contact the school via phone to discuss issues or concerns.

Music Tuition and Payments

Music tutors for violin, piano, guitar, drums, trumpet, saxophone and flute have commenced their 2021 tuition programs for students. This program continues to grow and impact our student's success at school.

A reminder that all Expressions of Interest (EOI) are to be submitted via the school app. If you have any difficulties email the school. All students seeking music tuition must submit a **new** EOI application. Parents engaging with music tutors through HWPS are asked to ensure the following guidelines regarding payment to tutors;

We value Respect for others

- Tutors must be paid in advance for the whole term, usually 9-10 weeks.
- Tutors will issue an invoice for the payment.
- Parents are to ensure that they pay promptly.
- Tutors will try to reschedule a lesson for a students who cannot attend a lesson, if they are
 given 24hours notice, however, parents are required to pay for lessons that they have booked,
 whether the child attends or not.

Music tutors are self-employed small business operators. Parents enter a contract with the music tuition provider and must respect the terms of the contract. Parents must be aware that the school takes no responsibility for the care and supervision of students in music tuition. We are proud to support the tuition opportunities and to include these tutors in school enrichment opportunities.

Our Fizzics incursion about electrical circuits and energy on Thursday last week, was packed with excitement and joy. Stage 3 were able to participate in cool experiments that blew our minds, like the fog experiment that showed us how sound energy travelled. This incursion has already given us a basic understanding of what we will be learning this semester's topic: how energy is transformed from one to another form and the increasing and decreasing strength of forces. Some things that Duncan showed us were how magic mugs react to boiling hot water, how solar panels work, how light circuits work and the magic that light can do for us on a daily basis and many more.
